Highlights from the June 19, 2024 Public Meeting

FAITH FORMATION

June's faith formation focused on demonstrating a life of faith to inspire others despite struggling at times with one's own personal faith journey.

The parable of Jesus walking on water and its allegory to individual faith journeys is a prime example of this experience.

EICS Director of Student and Staff Formation Jody Seymour recounted for Trustees that Peter was invited to join Jesus on the water, but starts to sink when doubt creeps in and he takes his eyes away from Jesus.

"When Peter panics and takes his eyes off Jesus, Jesus corrects him and shows him the way," Seymour said. "Jesus tells Peter to stay focused on Him. Seemingly simple, but we often lose sight.... We often lose trust and fall prey to the other

things and temptations that call us, or we believe in ourselves instead of him."

Seymour reminded Trustees that their own struggle with faith does not mean they should not answer God's call to make disciples. But that these struggles should encourage them to form a deeper relationship with Him.

"Being a disciple doesn't mean that we are perfect or that we have all the answers. Being a disciple means that we are sinners in need of a saviour, and we are on our own journey," she said.

"That journey means that we strive to follow Christ every day — first and foremost in having a personal relationship with Him."

CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR SELECTED FOR 2024-2025

Board Chair Le-Ann Ewaskiw was acclaimed to serve as Board Chair and Trustee Jean Boisvert was elected Vice-Chair at the Board's June Organizational Meeting.

Both will retain their roles until October 2025's municipal election.

Trustees tour Blessed Carlo Acutis Catholic School site

Blessed Carlo Acutis Catholic High School (BCA), our new high school in Camrose, is nearly a full year into construction and more than halfway to being complete.

On June 20, members of the EICS Board of Trustees and Senior Leadership toured the school for the first time since construction began in summer 2023.

Camrose MLA Jackie Lovely also toured the facility while members of Alberta Infrastructure and Delnor Construction were available to answer questions.

Construction is currently on pace to be completed in early 2025, with the high school slated to welcome students for the 2025-2026 school year.

The school's main foyer serves as a central hub with three branching halls that lead to instructional spaces, while the fourth leads to the administrative and staff offices. The school's chapel is immediately accessible from the foyer, as is the gym, and one of two learning commons for studies. There's a second learning commons on the south end of the school as well as dedicated drama and science rooms on the west side. BCA also features dedicated CTS areas for woodworking, food, and technology.

CELLPHONES IN SCHOOLS

On Monday, June Alberta Education 17 announced a ministerial order for school divisions to begin restricting cellphone and social media use during instructional time.

All school districts in

Alberta are required to have restrictions in place for Sept. 1, 2024 and a fully developed policy by Jan. 1, 2025.

Our division has had a Bring Your Own Device plan since 2016, and schools have been able to create their own cellphone policy since 2019.

Students have also been expected to abide by the division's policies regarding the use of cellphones and privacy rights of others.

LOCALLY **DEVELOPED COURSES**

Trustees approved adding Reading Foundation and Stained Glass courses for interested EICS schools beginning in 2024-2025.

Administrative Under Procedure 218, school administration is able

work with students to identify to potential courses before presenting it to school leadership and ultimately division administration. Alberta Education vetting and Trustee approval are then required before the courses can be offered.

EICS BOUNDARY UPDATED

Effective Sept. 1, 2024, the Elk Island Catholic Schools boundary will be updated to include sections of land southeast of Vegreville following a petition and vote that was driven by parents in the area in the spring.

The boundary now includes the land from the Imperial Roman Catholic Separate School District Alberta as outlined in Education's **Ministerial** Order 007/2024.

POLICY REVIEWS

The Policy Committee reviewed the following policies during June's public meeting:

- Policy 16: Recruitment and Selection of Personnel
- Policy 9: Board **Representatives**

Second reading for Policy 16 was approved. Changes added clarity to the superintendent being the only employee of the EICS Board of Trustees, and that position's role to ensure smooth operation of the division.

A minor change was also made to the requirements of the secretary-treasurer's hiring conditions.

Policy 9 did not pass second reading and will return to the Board in the fall with additional revisions.
