

### Education report highlights our division's strengths

#### **FAITH FORMATION**

Continuing the discussion on the eight encounters with Jesus that are chronicled in the Gospel of John, this month's EICS Board of Trustees meeting pondered the faith journey of Nicodemus from scepticism and resistance to growth and love.

In Chapter 3, Nicodemus comes to Jesus at night cautious but curious, asking how a person can be born again. Enlightened by his conversation with Christ, he later defends Jesus against the Pharisees and ultimately helps Joseph of Arimathea prepare the body of Jesus for burial after the crucifixion.

The journey of Nicodemus, from doubt to faith, is similar to one that many Catholics experience today, said Jody Seymour, our Director of Student and Staff Formation who leads the trustees' faith formation.

"Deep inside we long for

something more, something real, something that will satisfy us, but we often look for it in something other than God. We construct our own idols in His place. And we settle for counterfeit versions of His love," she said.

Our longing is where God will meet us. "He wants to heal our grief, draw us away from sin, and, most importantly,

reveal a love that satisfies us more than anything this world has to offer," she said.

"Ask yourself: Where are you on this spectrum? Do you find yourself moving toward or away from the light in different moments? Ultimately, Nicodemus reminds us that encountering Jesus invites us to leave darkness behind and embrace the light of truth,

love, and discipleship. God's light does not condemn but saves, calling us into a deeper relationship with Him."

# EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE REPORT APPROVED

The EICS 2023-2024 Annual Education Results Report was approved by trustees at their December Public Board Meeting.

Presented by Christina MacKinnon, our Assistant Superintendent of Educational Excellence, the full report is a snapshot of EICS success stories, goals and strategies, and areas of improvement from the previous school year.

This information is collected each year through EICS and Alberta Education survey feedback provided by staff, parents, and students, as well as through a deep analysis of student achievement that examines academic data and compares it to provincial

averages.

Information provided in this report is used by schools and departments across the division as they make plans for the future in the areas of EICS priorities of Faith Integration, Learners and Learning, Systemic Wellness, and Community Engagement. All priorities are connected to the Alberta Education Domains.

"Our commitment to building the capacity of administrators and teaching staff to support school achievement growth is directly impacting teaching and learning in the classroom," MacKinnon told the trustees. "We've built a culture of responsive teaching, and we're data driven to meet the needs of our students."

In addition, EICS Superintendent Paul Corrigan noted that the questions on the EICS survey are written to obtain clear information to avoid guesswork when looking at the data.

Looking at faith, "we have achieved highly in all areas," MacKinnon noted. "This is an area of strength for EICS. Our active citizenship remained high, forming faithful students and staff to be servants to God and each other by living out the Catholic Social Teachings."

Trustee Dean Sarnecki said he was, overall, impressed with the results. "I've been involved in a number of these over the years, and this report is a compliment to the staff and admin for the good work that they're doing."
