Following Christ's invitation: Trusting in the Bread of Life

February's Faith Formation during the EICS Board of Trustees' public meeting focused on John 6 and the pivot Jesus makes from delivering miracles to revealing Himself as the Bread of Life.

John 6 is a teaching that forms the foundation of our love and devotion to the Eucharist — the very center of our faith — explained Jody Seymour, our EICS Director of Student and Staff Formation.

After the miracles of feeding 5,000 followers and walking on water, Jesus shifts His message starting in John 6:22 from one of sustaining physical hunger to one of fulfilling eternal hunger.

The statements "I am the Bread of Life" (John 6:35, 48) and "I am the Living Bread" (John 6:51) connect Jesus to Exodus 3:14 and align Him with the God of Israel. His claims in these passages are

so radical that many of His disciples chose to walk away — and Jesus lets them.

"Jesus does not force belief," Seymour noted. "He invites it. We are free to accept or reject the truth of His presence in the Eucharist."

She also challenged the Trustees to consider their

own personal beliefs: "Do we trust that Jesus is who He says He is? Is He truly the source of life for us, or do we look elsewhere for fulfillment?"

Ultimately, John 6 offers three key themes that Catholic faith is based on:

• The Eucharist as

the Ultimate Truth

- Jesus does not soften His teaching in John 6, even when many walk away. His real presence in the Eucharist is central to our faith and salvation.
- Faith Requires
 Trust, Not Full
 Understanding Like
 Peter, we may not fully
 grasp Christ's words,
 but true discipleship
 means trusting that
 He alone has the
 words of eternal life.
- A Defining Moment:
 Stay or Leave The
 Bread of Life Discourse
 forces a choice. Just
 as the disciples had
 to decide whether to
 accept or reject Jesus'
 teaching, we are invited
 to reaffirm our belief
 in His real presence
 and deepen our faith.

School calendars, Al guidelines, and wellness initiatives take focus

BOARD from Page 2 CALENDARS APPROVED

The EICS Board of Trustees formally approved the 2025-2026 school calendars.

The Board also approved in-principle the 2026-2027 school year calendar for Fort Saskatchewan, Sherwood Park, Strathcona County, and Vegreville, which will be shared with our schools for feedback. More on **Page 4**.

ENROLMENT PROJECTIONS

According to early projections, 8,929 students are anticipated to enrol for the 2025-2026 school year.

Alberta Education requires school divisions to provide an early projection in January to assist with its funding plan for the upcoming provincial budget.

Funding for the 2025-2026 school year will be determined by Alberta Education this spring, with final enrolment confirmed after classes begin in the fall.

WELLNESS UPDATE

The EICS Wellbeing at Work Cohort was formed to address staff wellness throughout the division, and includes teachers, school principals, and division psychologists.

The cohort's second meeting will be held on Friday, Feb. 28.

EICS AI SUBCOMMITTEE

A subcommittee has been created to draft and propose an Administrative Procedure regarding the use of Artificial Intelligence within EICS that is aligned with the division's academic and professional integrity.

The nine-member subcommittee includes principals, staff consultants and tech leads, directors, and the division's communication coordinator.

Their first meeting is on Tuesday, Feb. 25.

BISHOPS' ASSURANCE UPDATE

EICS Board Chair Le-Ann Ewaskiw and Superintendent Paul Corrigan met with members of the Catholic Bishops of Alberta and the Northwest Territories on Friday, Feb. 21. Superintendent Corrigan presented an update on activities between our division and the Catholic Archdiocese of Edmonton as part of the Bishops' Assurance Pilot Project.

TAXATION LETTER



Calendars approved for 2025-2026 school year

The EICS Board of Trustees approved the 2025-2026 school year calendars at their Feb. 19 public meeting.

Each year, the goal is to develop a calendar that meets required instruction hours, supports a quality learning environment, and provides for teacher and staff professional development.

In addition, EICS takes into consideration the calendars for Elk Island Public Schools and Battle River School Division. While our

division provides student transportation in Sherwood Park and Strathcona County, we have cooperative busing agreements in place with our public board counterparts in Vegreville, Camrose, and Fort Saskatchewan.

New this year, schools in Fort Saskatchewan, Sherwood Park, Strathcona County, and Vegreville will have early dismissal every Wednesday.

In Camrose, Our Lady of Mount Pleasant and Blessed Carlo Acutis Catholic schools will operate four-day student weeks. St. Patrick Catholic School will continue with five-day student weeks.

in Camrose.




2026-2027 SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR



Student Transportation merges safety and faith

StudentTransportation's February presentation to the EICS Board of Trustees touched on its effort to continue to align itself with the division's Catholic teachings and leadership.

Currently, EICS Student Transportation features 36 school bus routes within Sherwood Park and Strathcona County.

FIRST RIDER PROGRAM

Last August, 94 students registered in the First Rider program, granting kids who had not previously ridden a school bus the opportunity to see one up close, learn best practices about bus safety and rider behaviour, and take a short ride with their parents.

Transportation Director Mike Hayden said he is pleased with the feedback he has heard from parents about the program, as well as its overall growth in registrations from year to year.

Sent to all EICS bus drivers, it includes tips that range from health and wellness, to driving and student safety best practices, and preventative maintenance.

FAITHFUL JOURNEYS

Looking to the future, Hayden noted that Student Transportation is exploring a Faithful Journeys program for 2025-2026 that rewards students who demonstrate good behaviour while riding the bus.

"They've done an amazing job seeing themselves and responding to the Assurance Plan," Superintendent Corrigan told the Board.

Archbishop Richard Smith, who attended a portion of the public meeting, said he was impressed with the initiative to seek out opportunities to instill Catholic teachings.
